

## CARING FOR YOUR CAMELLIAS IN JULY & AUGUST- PETER LEVICK

#### **AUGUST**

This is the month when all camellias other than sasanquas, should receive their major annual feeding. Apart from aged animal manure, the most effective fertiliser is the pelletised slow-release form. The 12-to-13-month type will provide more nutrients in the warmer months, whilst growing a smaller amount in the colder months when the bush is flowering. Camellia japonicas that have finished flowering can be pruned if it is considered necessary. August westerly winds have a very drying effect on the garden and particular attention must be paid to watering and the irrigation system. These winds often extend into September.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

Most japonicas will finish their blooming this month and this is the best time for pruning, if it is deemed necessary. A few camellias can be given a 'haircut'. This means an overall cutting back of last year's growth, as it suits the growth habit, but most need to have an open appearance. In America they say that, after pruning 'a bird could fly through it'. The problem is, should the bird be a Blue Wren or a Wedgetail Eagle?

Thrips can also blow in on a westerly wind and suck at the underside of the leaves. Two-Spotted mites can also cause a dusty browning of the leaf underside. If severe, they can be controlled with a miticide. (a chemical that kills mites).

#### Competition

A 'Novice' exhibitor has not won the annual 'Novice' championship, nor have they scored 20 points in a monthly 'Open' competition. The competition year starts in March, and a 'Novice' in March remains so to the end of that year. A bloom exhibited by a 'Novice' can win in 'Open' classes.

#### **Points**

'Open' and 'Novice' Classes 1 to 16: 1st = 3 points; 2nd = 2 points; 3rd = 1 point (if required) 'Open' and

'Novice' Collections Classes C1 to C2:  $1^{st} = 6$  points;  $2^{nd} = 4$  points;  $3^{rd} = 1$  point (if required) 'Open' and

'Novice' Champion bloom (from the winning blooms) Extra 3 points.

'Open' and 'Novice' Class A  $1^{st} = 3$  points;  $2^{nd} = 2$  points;  $3^{rd} = 1$  point (if required)


## ❖ Open Garden (10am to 3pm)
